

## CLPM CHARACTERISTICS

Knowing a few interesting things about CLPM may help you research clients in EIS.

If a client is coded 'OU' on SEPA, the 'OU' participation may not be seen on the CLPM.

- Scenario: Carrie Williams applied for food stamps for herself and her spouse and was approved on 09/4/01. In 11/01 the case was closed effective 11/30/01. She returns to apply for food stamps on 3/5/02 for herself and her spouse. She is approved, but this time she is found to be an ineligible student and is coded 'OU' for food stamps.
- When an inquiry is done for Carrie, her CLPM shows that the case was closed as of 113001. The current application registration does not display for Carrie. If the CAP2 screen is viewed for this case, it will show the FS program is open for food stamps.

If a client has always been 'OU' on a case number (never was IN), the CLPM shows the program type, case number, 'OU' and the relationship code of PI, CH, SP etc but the screen does not show any dates.

If you are inquiring whether a client has received a MED or GM benefits for a particular month, be sure to check all the case numbers for the client even if they have an OU participation for the MED and GM case numbers. Check the MEIH or GMIH screens to verify which benefit months were issued to the client. The client may be 'OU' on one case number so that he or she may be coded 'IN' for another case number for one or more months.
